1.0 Reason

As individuals, communities and as God's Church we are considering what our priorities are and where God is leading us. Over recent years, several individuals and congregations within our Mission Area have been wrestling, prayerfully with the question "where does our future lie?". As a result, conversations started more widely about the broad idea of **"One Church – 4 Locations"** and this document aims to bring together some of those thoughts and aspirations. **This document is not intended to contain significant detail but more a roadmap of where we see our vision for the future, as the Felixstowe Mission Area (FMA).** This document also takes into account some feedback from the "Vision 22 Away Day" held in May 2022. During the 2021/22 Methodist year we have not had a presbyter stationed to the FMA, however, this vision was fed into the profile for the new Circuit Minister for the FMA, who will be joining us in September 2022. It is felt that it is extremely important that our new Minister, Rev Abe Konadu-Yiadam, is aligned with, and aware of, the shared vision of the FMA and can then join us on that journey. Abe will have the benefit of the preparatory work undertaken around the vision but will still be able to influence the path we are taking together.

Looking around the four churches there are some common themes and concerns, plus some issues which are relevant to a subset of the churches:

- Financial challenges
- Resources - people
- Resources - buildings
- The Environment and the part we play
- Ageing congregations

Many of these issues are ones which will be shared by any number of churches across a variety of denominations, but it is felt that this is a unique opportunity to consider the way forward and to do this from a position of relative strength, rather than wait for events to overtake us.

In addition, our response to the current climate and environmental crisis is one which cannot be delayed. We have a responsibility to act **now** in protecting God's world.

Therefore, we feel **the time is right** for us to consider God's plan for us.

2.0 Where are we?

Each of our four Churches have initiatives and activities which are working well in their own communities and, moving forward, it would be wise to look at these and to see which areas can be enhanced. It would also be wise to look at each of these areas and decide if they are sustainable, given the resources we have.

Some of the areas where the individual churches are working well are:

- Local neighbourhood outreach
- Work with children
- Ecumenical links and initiatives (for example, the commitment to partnership working with Walton Parish Nursing, Trinity sharing services with the URC for many years, especially at Christmas and Easter time)
- Music in, and outside of, Worship
- Diversity of Worship
- Community events, both regular and one-off

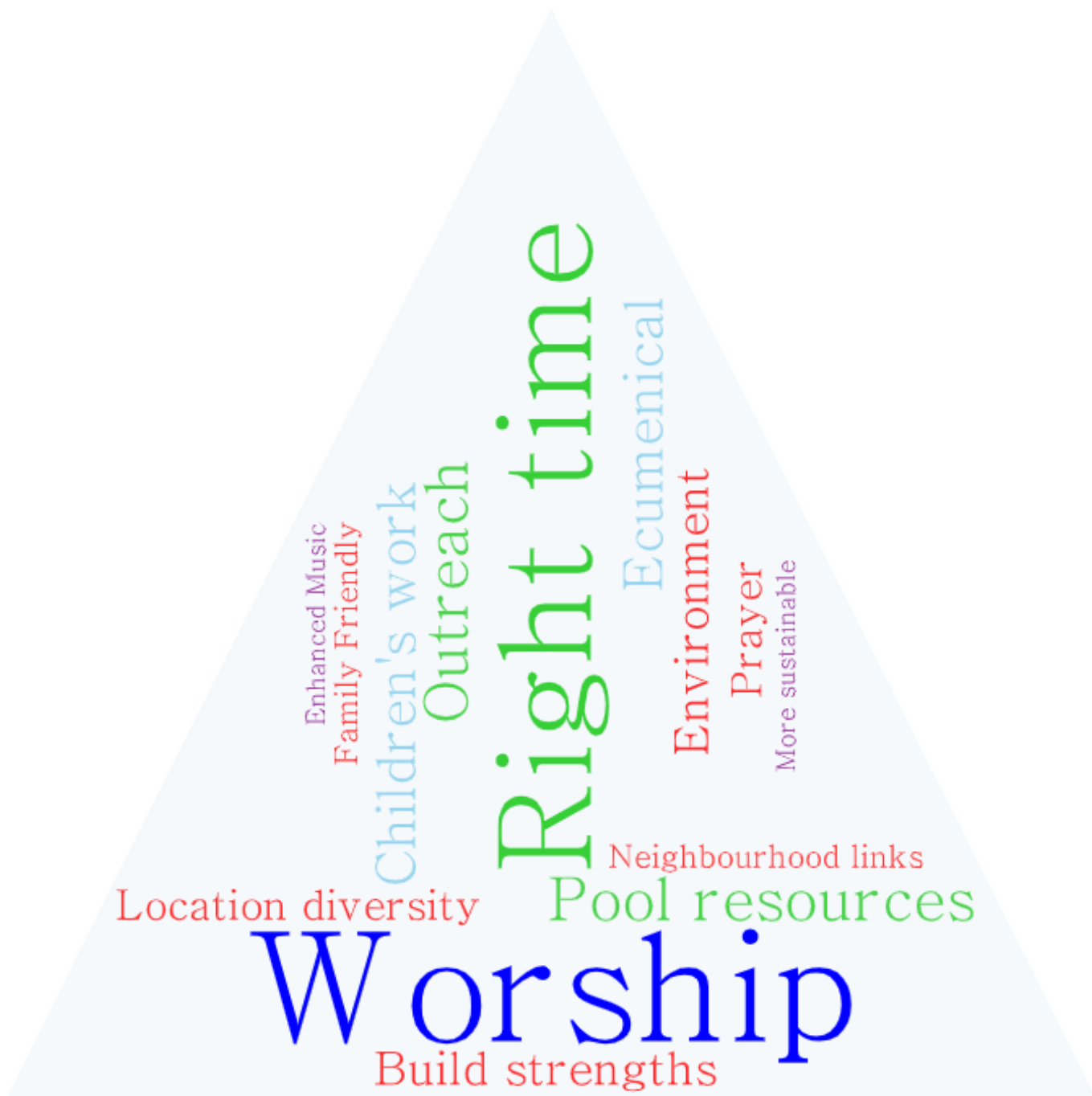
In addition, the FMA is already working together in a number of areas such as:

- Planning for the Holiday Clubs at Seaton Road and Trinity since 2010
- Annual “Remembering Service”, held at Trinity – since 2006
- Monthly Kids’ Club, held at Seaton Road – since 2010
- Working with St Mary’s Walton on weekly Messy Church
- Messy Church (3 or 4 times a year), held at Trinity
- Supporting each other across churches in the FMA
- Joint FMA services
- Holy Week Meditations (for the past 10 years)
- Shoe Box Appeal – initially individual churches – now FMA
- Mission Area Magazine

The challenges faced with the range of activities with which the FMA are involved should not be underestimated – an increasing desire to expand those activities but with decreasing resources. **Together, we can do more!**

3.0 The way ahead

From feedback received from all four Churches in the FMA the following highlights were extracted as being important to our vision (size of words/phrases reflect the number of times these are mentioned in the feedback):



Therefore, to look at these areas in terms of our vision as the Felixstowe Mission Area – “One Church – 4 Locations”:

Worship

To focus our Worship, reduce the number of services on a Sunday across the 4 locations but allow for the continued diversity of Worship styles and location. Continue with Worship and fellowship opportunities during the week. To this end we are currently experimenting with having two services across the FMA each week, with all services starting at 10 a.m. A Worship Exploration Group has been established to look at the planning of worship in our churches with this group being open to anyone across the FMA. There are considerable limitations in terms of Local Preacher and Minister availability and, therefore, we are trying to help alleviate that pressure at a Circuit level. This is being done by using some of our own resources, such as a team to lead worship, using video sermons etc.

Action: To continue exploring Worship and to encourage, in any way we can, our congregation to be more “mobile” and to look at worshipping in other than “their own” Church buildings.

Prayer: Remind ourselves that God can be found in many different places and situations. Pray for those who are, for whatever reason, apprehensive about worshipping in other locations. Ask for God’s help to find solutions to overcome any barriers which restrict where people worship.

Personal prayer topics:

Right time

There is a strong feeling that this is a real opportunity for change. As we came out of the Covid pandemic, there was a feeling that things cannot be allowed to “go back to how it was before”. Not that things were, necessarily, all negative but that this is the time for us to look carefully at the future of all the Churches in the FMA and agree a vision which comes from a point of strength.

Action: Continue to think about what God’s plan is for us, right now.

Prayer: To seek God’s plan for us as his worshipping and serving Church in this particular area.

Personal prayer topics:

Pool resources

Enable our resources, both material and people resources, to be brought together for the greater good of the FMA. Enable people to become involved in areas where they may not have had the opportunity before. This also covers those areas where there is duplication:

- Management of property
- Management of finance
- Church outreach opportunities
- Work with children and young people
- Ecumenical work
- Environmental concerns
- Other special interest groups

Financial implications: coming together as “One Church” will bring our financial resources and responsibilities together. In order to achieve this overall vision there will be a financial implication. However, as part of this we need to look, for example, at the buildings we have within the FMA; in particular, some preliminary discussion has already taken place about the two buildings at Seaton Road and whether there is a need for two buildings in order to maintain the witness and outreach from that location. Working with the Circuit and District, we could look at the financial implications of potentially rationalising our buildings and using some of the capital released from this exercise to support this vision into the future. It is also anticipated that, by being “One Church”, there might be savings which could be explored. There would be no plan, within this vision, to close any of the four existing locations. The financial implications are extremely important and would need to be addressed as we move forward. There is a feeling that we need to look very carefully at our stewardship of our buildings to explore our priorities for the future. The emphasis at the Away Day in May 2022 was very much on the Church being the people and the witness rather than being the buildings.

More important than the pooling of financial resources is that of “people” resources. **By bringing together the time, energy, enthusiasm, diversity and talents of all the individuals in the four locations, we would be able to achieve so much more than we could working separately.**

Action: As we seek to move to a single Church Council, to look for inventive ways in which we can better work together in these areas.

Prayer: Lord, give us the courage, patience, energy and inspiration to seek more effective ways of working together so that we can spend more of our time on sharing our faith and showing God's love to others. Help us be realistic and forward-thinking about the use of our buildings and other resources.

Personal prayer topics:

Outreach and neighbourhood links

Given the diversity of the four locations, the opportunity for outreach is equally diverse: whether it be coffee mornings in the Town Centre, Community events in all our locations, Children's work, indoor and outdoor events, organisations using our premises and many others. These events provide an excellent opportunity for mission which we would be better placed to undertake together. During the summer of 2021, a weekly event was held in the garden at Kirton, organised and staffed by folk from around the FMA. This proved extremely popular with people from the village and beyond. This is being repeated in 2022, thanks to volunteers from Seaton Road and Trinity churches and the community in Kirton village and, of course, the goodwill of the music makers.

Further opportunities continue to present themselves. For example, the link which has been established with the Trimley Red Devils (Young People's Football Team which meets on a Saturday morning on the recreation field opposite Seaton Road). Members from across the FMA come together to provide bacon and sausage baps for the spectators.

Housing developments around our town and villages is planned to increase significantly and, whether we support this or not, this provides an opportunity for outreach and witness. Outreach, however, requires resources in terms of "people" and, working together will provide us with a greater resource in all these areas. A small group has been set up to specifically look at the opportunities around the new housing developments in Trimley. We will be stronger together than we are separately.

Action: Look for opportunities to share God's love with those communities around the four church locations.

Prayer: To further establish and develop links we already have. For new opportunities and for the people to come forward to support our outreach. Keeping in mind that what we do, we do in order to share God's love and message.

Personal prayer topics:

Ecumenical and Community links

In a variety of ways, we already have strong Ecumenical links and this vision does not see these diminishing but, rather, through coming together, we would be able to further strengthen the links we already have and, also, establish new ones. Several Methodists are active on the committees of local charities such as Christian Aid, Fairtrade, CAP (Christians Against Poverty) and the Level Two Youth Project.

Action: Continually look for ways in which we can work with other denominations and community groups to avoid duplication of effort.

Prayer: Ask for God’s strength to build better and more productive links with other denominations.

Personal prayer topics:

Environmental

The current climate emergency should focus everyone’s mind to work together towards a solution. This includes our Church. By working as “one Church” we will rationalise, optimise and reduce our carbon impact. This may be through the management of our buildings, the way in which we organise regular Worship and other meetings, the reduction in travel (e.g. less Ministers and Local Preachers having to travel to the Mission Area), more on-line meetings when possible and appropriate etc. A Climate Emergency Group has been formed to look at these issues and to help raise awareness.

Action: Continue to raise the profile of the current climate emergency.

Prayer: Pray for the planet that we have “in trust” from God.

Personal prayer topics:

Children’s work

The FMA already works together successfully on a number of initiatives in this area. The vision would be to take a fresh look at these and to see where further integration might be possible. We should also ask a number of questions, such as:

- Where are the best places to hold children’s activities?
- Can we work with other denominations to avoid duplication?
- Can we, together, have a “plan” for the young people associated with our Church? This is so they don’t just “drop off the radar” as they get older.

We have started to pick up on certain children’s work following the pandemic. For example:

- “Open the Book” – a group from the FPMC have now started going back into Colneis Junior School and Fairfield Infants School Assemblies to lead an Open the Book session. During the latter stages of the pandemic we were able to provide these sessions using a Zoom link.
- Including some children’s activities as part of the Kirton Garden events on a Tuesday.

Action: Plan for a short Holiday Club event during October 2022 half-term.

Pray: For all the children and parents who have some link to our Church. Pray for others to come forward to help lead some of these activities.

Personal prayer topics:

Family Friendly

Encourage families to become engaged in our Church – through weekday links and through Worship. Build on the experiences of the individual Churches in this aspect.

Action: Ensure that each of our Church locations have some suitable activities should a family with children come along to one of our services.

Pray: For all the families that are moving into the new housing in the area.

Personal prayer topics:

Enhanced Music

There is, obviously, a very strong tradition of music within Methodism and, certainly, within the FMA, we have some very talented musicians, singers etc. Coming together to allow this aspect to further flourish and grow would be a real benefit to Worship and other areas of our Church life. Already there have been opportunities for a selection of musicians from across the FMA to come together to provide music for worship.

Action: Think about forming a Music interest group so that others can explore ways in which they can be involved.

Pray: Give thanks for those who regularly provide music for our worship.

Personal prayer topics:

Prayer

This should have started already! We need to underpin all this vision with prayer, **seeking God's direction in all this, not our own.**

Action: Create a Vision 22 WhatsApp group for prayer.

Pray: Always!

4.0 Process

How do we move forward? We need to continue to communicate this Vision with everyone within our Church community so that all are aware, and part of, the process. It should be noted that any fundamental change to the structures, within and between the Churches, would require the agreement of each of the Church Councils. Without giving exact timescales, the process could look like this:

Share this vision with our church communities and amend as required.

Hold a forum to discuss this feedback. *Done*

A group to look at Worship patterns across the 4 locations. *Done*

Set up other special interest groups (as has happened with the Climate Emergency Group, Worship Exploration Group) to look at specific areas of our Church life. These groups should report back to each of the 4 Church Councils. *Underway* *See below.

Once agreed within the FMA, share this vision with the Circuit Leadership Team and the Chair of District. This outline vision should be fed into the profile for any prospective minister for 2022. *Done*

At an appropriate time, hold a joint Church meeting for all four Churches to have an open and honest “where we are at” discussion. *Done*

Look to move to “One Church”, with a single Church Council. Each individual Church Council discussing and making a decision on this proposal. *Done*

Seek approval for a single Church Council from the Circuit Meeting – *Done and approved*

Then, the really EXCITING work starts!

**Special Interest Groups* – these groups would look at aspects such as Worship, Climate Emergency, Outreach, Children’s work, Ecumenical links, Finance, Managing our buildings etc. It will be important that these groups do not get into too much detail too soon but start by looking at the overall direction of travel for these aspects of our Church life.

5.0 Summary points

- This is a real **OPPORTUNITY** for something radical to happen within the Felixstowe Peninsula Methodist Churches.
- This is **THE RIGHT TIME**.
- This vision comes from a point of **STRENGTH**, not weakness. Each Church could continue (for a time) but it is better to act now, as we have the energy and enthusiasm to do so.
- **PRAYER and WORSHIP** will underpin our way forward.
- Let's take the problems and concerns as opportunities to **DO THINGS DIFFERENTLY**.
- This vision should not be seen as any one Church joining with another – we will be creating something **NEW AND EXCITING**.
